Driving Directions to USC Parking Structure 2 (PS2) – University Park (Main) Campus
PS2 is located on the northeast corner of Figueroa Street and Exposition Blvd.

110 (HARBOR) NORTH

To park in Structure 2 (PS2) take the Exposition exit. Go straight through the 37th Street light. Keep left. Go under the freeway bridge. Cross Flower at the light and turn right at Figueroa. Turn right into the structure entrance (by Radisson Hotel).

110 (HARBOR/PASADENA) SOUTH

To park in Structure 2 (PS2) take the Exposition exit. Cross Flower at the light and turn right at Figueroa. Turn right into the structure entrance (by Radisson Hotel).

10 (SANTA MONICA) EAST

To park in Structure 2 (PS2) take the Hoover exit, turn right at the light. Go all the way to where Hoover ends at Jefferson. Turn left on Jefferson then right on Flower. Turn right into the structure

10 (SANTA MONICA) WEST

To park in Structure 2 (PS2) take the Hoover exit. Turn left on Hoover and go all the way to where Hoover ends at Jefferson. Turn left on JEFFERSON, right on Flower and then right into the structure.
