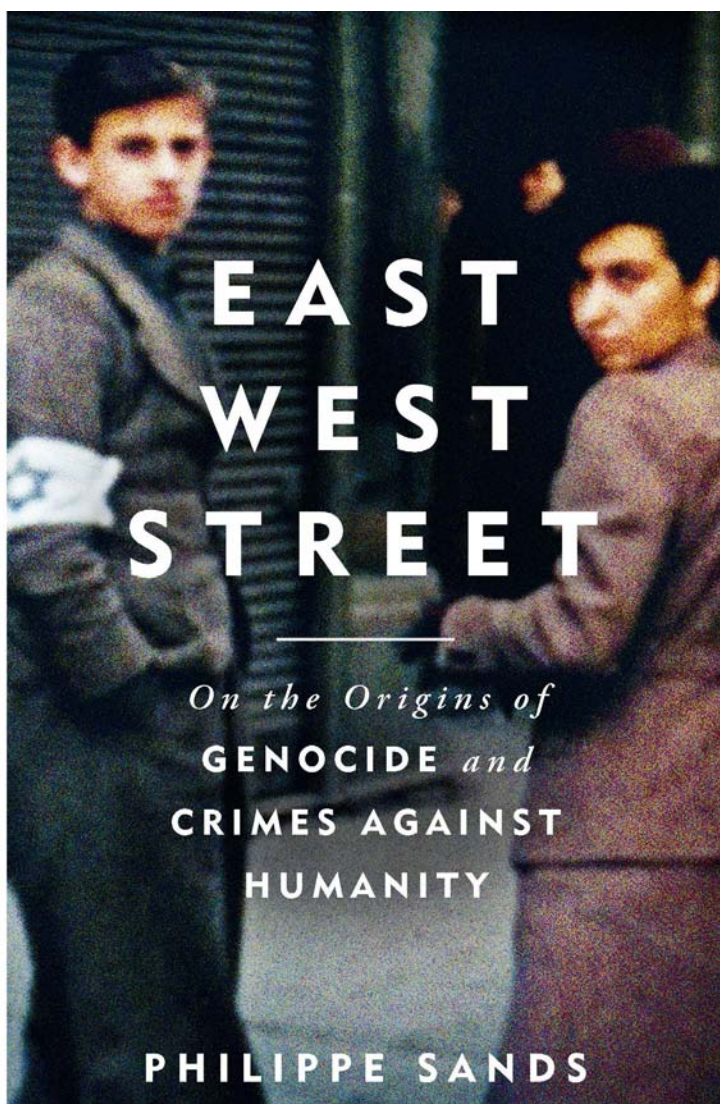


GENOCIDE AND CRIMES AGAINST HUMANITY UNDER INTERNATIONAL LAW: A PERSONAL STORY
